# Juniors (Grade 11)

#### High School Planning Guide

- Continue reviewing your course of study with your guidance counselor to insure being on track for graduation/college admission. Keep grades up all year long!

- Attend the local college fair as announced by the guidance office.

- Meet with college representatives as they visit our school throughout the year.

- Begin in earnest to investigate college scholarship/financial aid opportunities – apply when appropriate.

- Begin meeting with your guidance counselor (parents are welcome too!) to learn more about colleges in our area, the state, and/or outside-of-state.

- Continue investigating career options - using Guidance Direct online

- Continue participation and leadership roles in various school, church, and community organizations.

- Take the PSAT in the Fall to become eligible for The National Merit Scholarship Competition. Students qualify for this competition in the 11th grade only. All college bound juniors are encouraged to take the test.

- Take the SAT (The Scholastic Aptitude Test) in the Spring (dates will follow below). Follow up again with another SAT early in your senior year.

- Create a resume (see your guidance counselor for various formats).

- Begin college visits during the spring semester of this year.

- Register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at the end of this year if you plan to participate in Division I or II collegiate athletics.

- Meet with the guidance counselor in the spring to discuss senior year courses and graduation requirements.

#### <u>Timeline</u>

#### September

To start the year as a junior a student has to have earned at least 11 credits

Start of the 1<sup>st</sup> marking period covering the first 10 weeks of school

Students receive 1<sup>st</sup> semester schedules in mail. All students are now required to take 3 credits plus 1/4 credit Physical Education each semester

Add/drop deadline for all classes - end of 2<sup>nd</sup> week of school

Junior Assembly - The student handbook outlining policies and procedures is covered in an assembly with the principal

College bound juniors should consider registering for at least one of the following SAT exams
