Please be sure to discuss and practice the fire safety plan for your household. Remember prevention and preparation are very important. Smoke alarms that work and escape plans that are reviewed regularly are two key ways in which children can feel prepared if a fire were to occur.

We also celebrate School Bus Safety in October. During October students learn about proper entry and exit of the bus. They also learn how to identify escape routes and locate emergency supplies. This year's theme is "At my stop, you stop!" It is important that students of every age understand how to board the bus and exit the bus safely and that good bus behavior helps to ensure a safe ride for all.
