# What is STEAM Education?

You've probably heard a lot about STEAM in the news lately. STEAM stands for science,



technology, engineering, art, and math. In the school setting, STEAM is an interdisciplinary approach to learning. When these areas are taught in an integrated way, students are better able to appreciate how each part is necessary for the success of any complex, real world project.

The idea behind STEAM education is to prepare students for successful careers in the 21st century workforce. We live in a time of knowledge and information explosion. Our children will be working in jobs that don't even exist today. One thing which is certain about careers of the future is that they will involve constant change. STEAM education seeks to teach students to be creative, innovative, critical thinkers; all skills needed for adapting to change. It engages students in project based learning, where they are often given real world engineering challenges. Teams of students work together to seek multiple solutions to these challenges. They learn that failure is sometimes part of the process and they should seek to try again and improve upon ideas. #### <u>Clinic Plus Program</u>

It is natural to measure your child's height and weight, or to assess their hearing, vision or other health concerns. Emotional health issues can affect how children perform in school, how they relate to family members, and their ability to make friends. Family Enrichment Network and Broome County Mental Health, in cooperation with your school district, are pleased to make a *free, voluntary, and confidential* questionnaire available to help you assess your child's emotional health.

The Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire will be distributed to parents of students in grades K-8 who attend Broome County Schools. Parents/guardians should take a moment to review the packet, complete the permission form and questionnaire, and return the survey to school or via postal mail in the envelope provided. The Clinic Plus Coordinator will score the assessments and return results **only to the parent/guardian,** unless they have provided consent to share the results with school staff.

The district's School Health Services program supports student's academic success by promoting health in the school setting. All new students to the district: Vision and Hearing Screenings Kindergarten: Vision Screening First Grade: Vision and Hearing Screenings Second Grade: Vision Screening Third Grade: Vision and Hearing Screenings Fourth Grade: No scheduled screenings Fifth Grade: Vision and Hearing and Scoliosis (curvature of the spine) Screenings

### **Annual Notification**

### NOTICE TO PARENTS AND ELIGIBLE STUDENTS OF RIGHTS UNDER THE FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

You are notified that you have the following rights in relation to student records.

The right to inspect and review student's educational records.

- The school district shall limit the disclosure of information contained in the student's educational record except a) by prior written consent of eligible student's parents or the eligible student, b) directory of information, or c) under certain limited circumstances as permitted by FERPA.
- The right of a student's parents or an eligible student to seek to correct parts of the education record, which he or she believes to be inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of the student's rights. This right includes the right to a hearing to present evidence that the record shall be changed if the district decides not to alter it according to the parents or eligible student.

The right of any person to file a complaint with the Department of Education if the school district violates FERPA.

If either a student's parents or eligible student desires to obtain copies of BOE policy 26, pertaining to student records, notification should be presented to the district superintendent in writing.

Parents and eligible students have the following under the Family and Education Privacy Act and Board Bylaw:

The right to inspect and review student's educational records.

The right to exercise a limited control over other people's access to the student's educational records.

The right to seek and correct the student's educational record, in a hearing if necessary.

The right to report violations of the FERPA to the Department of Education.

The right to be informed about FERPA rights.

All rights and protections given parents under FERPA and this policy transfers to the student when he or she reaches 18 or enrolls in a post secondary school. The student then becomes an "eligible student".

### Section 504 Annual Notification

In accordance with the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 commonly known as Section 504, the Deposit Central School District hereby notifies disabled children and their parents of the Deposit School District duty under the Regulations to Section 504.

The School District shall provide a free appropriate public education to each qualified disabled child who resides in the School District regardless of the nature or severity of the disability. The School district shall educate each qualified disabled child with children who are not disabled to the maximum extent appropriate to the needs of the disabled child, and shall also ensure that disabled children participate with non-disabled children in nonacademic and extra-curricular activities to the maximum extent appropriate. A disabled child shall be afforded an equal opportunity for participation in such services and activities. The Deposit School District shall provide disabled children an equal opportunity for participation in physical education courses, interscholastic, club or intramural athletics.

The Deposit School District shall conduct pre-placement evaluations, and shall establish standards and procedures consistent with Section 104.35 for the evaluation and placement of children who need or are believed to need special education or related services. Periodic reevaluation shall be conducted of children who have been provided special education or related services.

Placement decisions shall draw upon information from a variety of sources and shall be made by a group of persons knowledgeable about the child, the meaning of the evaluation data, and placement options. The Deposit School District shall establish and implement a system of procedural safeguards that includes notice, an opportunity for the parent to examine relevant records, an impartial hearing with the opportunity for participation by the parent and representation by counsel, and a review procedure.
