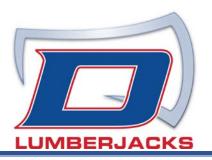

In an effort to provide students with a hands-on, trade-based education while at the same time improving the quality of life in the community, the DCS Community Project Partnership has been created. Through the Advanced Carpentry Course, DCS students will work under a certified instructor to complete carpentry projects in the community. Under this model, students are learning and community members are able to afford small projects that are needed for their home or business. Owners in the community will be eligible to apply for a project. The procedures to be followed include:

STEP 1	Community members (business owners and home owners) fill
	out the community project application. Applications can be

	Completed applications are submitted to Karen Armbrust, High
	School Principal or to: <u>projects@deposit.stier.org</u>
STEP 2	The Community Project Partnership Committee meets to review
	the applications and agree on potential projects that meet the
	criteria.
STEP 3	If a project meets the criteria, the instructor will contact the
	owner to set up a site visit to ensure viability and estimate
	costs.
STEP 4	Following the site visit, the committee will meet again to
	confirm viability. If a project is approved, the instructor will
	contact the owner to inform them of approval. The owner will
	be provided with a) the finalized application with approval b)
	the "agreement" to be signed and c) the Community Project
	Work Order which includes a description of the work and an
	estimated cost of materials. If the project is rejected or
	pending, Mrs. Armbrust or Mrs. Campo will notify the owner.
STEP 5	When the agreements are finalized, the instructor will
	designate a start date and estimated completion time with the
	Owner.
STEP 6	When the project is finished, the Owner and District will sign
2 3	the appropriate form to indicate completion.
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
