

# **Protocol for symptomatic or** positive COVID-19 student or staff

## **Definition of COVID-19 exposure:**

Within fewer than 6 feet for more than 10 minutes (masks are not a mitigating factor) of an individual who has tested positive or who has been exposed to a known positive case and is exhibiting

two or more COVID-like symptoms during their infectious period (two days prior to their test or first symptoms, until no longer showing symptoms or 10 days after their positive test).

### Student/staff member has any of the following symptoms (not related to chronic health conditions)

- Fever or chills
- Shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing
- Fatigue

- Muscle or body aches
- Nausea or vomiting
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Sore throat
- Diarrhea



Send to school nurse's isolation area where the parent/guardian will pick up student. Staff member or parent/guardian will need to contact health care provider (or local clinic/ urgent care center).

If student or staff member has emergency warning signs while waiting, 911 will be called and operator notified that the person may have COVID-19



#### Student or staff member may return to school if:

- they have a note from a medical provider: AND
  - they have a negative COVID-19 test



# Student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19:

The school will notify the local health department (LHD) (or the local health department will notify the school if they are notified first)



- 1. The local health department (LHD) will contact the student, parent/guardian or staff member who tested positive to start contact tracing.
- 2. The LHD will notify the school for assistance with contact tracing.
- 3. Anyone who is considered a close contact will be guarantined for 14 days from the last exposure and should monitor for symptoms. Testing is recommended 5-7 days after exposure.
