
**WINTER 2024 - FAMILY UPDATES**

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS: Part of our annual capital improvement plan includes the upgrade of the HS auditorium due to age, wear, and safety hazards with flooring and seating. During winter break, the work in the auditorium began. The seating has been removed in order to prep for new flooring, aisle lighting, carpeting, and new seating. In addition, the stage front will get a makeover. We're hoping that the work will be completed by March. We can't wait to see the results! 

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


SPECIAL PROPOSITION VOTE: On March 4, 2024, taxpayers will have the opportunity to vote on a few propositions. This is a separate vote from the annual budget vote in May, but operates in the same manner. Voting will take place in the band room from 3-8 PM on March 4th with a snow day planned for March 6th. More information will be provided at in-person meetings during the month of February. Dates for those meetings will be published in The Courier and on our Facebook and website pages. The propositions are as follows:

- Prop #1: The use of the capital reserve fund to a maximum of \$600,000 for improvements to the safety and security features in the district. Specifically, this is to upgrade our software systems and mechanical systems related to our lock-down equipment (badging/access control/public announcement systems) and our camera systems. This involves the district switching to a new vendor and the takeover of our current system. There will be NO ADDITIONAL TAX IMPACT from the taxpayers. ZERO additional tax impact.
- Prop #2: Establishes a new capital reserve fund. Capital reserve funds are basically savings accounts that must be used for improvements to facilities. The accounts expire over the years and new accounts must be established. This is not related to funding the reserve for a specific amount, but just the permission to open the new account.
- Prop #3: Allows the district to transport all students in grades k-5 on district transportation regardless of mileage. Currently, we bus students in the elementary building if they live more than .5 miles from the school. MS/HS is established at more than 1 mile from the school. NYS requires transportation at the 2 and 3 mile marker. The District has to get voter approval in order to transport students who live in shorter distances than what they have established. The District is looking to offer transportation to all students in grades k-5 regardless of distance. All pre-k students are already transported despite transportation distances.

CAFÉ DEPO: The student café in the HS Library had a soft opening on Friday, January 12th. Business was booming and the students are already learning valuable lessons about running a small business, food service operations, and communication skills. Thank you to everyone involved including Mr. Hertzog, Mrs. Wehrli, and Mrs. MacDonald.



ELECTRIC BUSES: You may have heard the hype about the need for school districts to purchase electric buses or green buses in the year 2027. Some local districts have already purchased a bus with grant funding in order to be prepared. Currently, the expectation is that all new buses purchased in the year 2027 and thereafter will be electric/green. There are many problems with this proposition including the fact that the buses are prone to fires and will not travel far without needing to be charged. In our district, for example, we would only be able to use the buses to drive around the village. Additionally, there would need to be changes to the bus garage itself in order to accommodate the charging, lift, and storage needs. At this point, we are working with our architects to do our due diligence and conduct a study of the facilities so we are prepared with the knowledge of how these changes will affect our district financially. At the same time, we are not planning to rush into anything without additional information, a mandate, or financial backing from the State or Federal Government. You can read more at:
