

2018 HALL OF FAME HONOREE Christopher Zacharias, Class of 2003



Following his graduation from DCS in 2003, Christopher Zacharias attended Onondaga Community College where he earned an A.A.S. in Fire Protection Technology in 2005. During his time in college, Christopher received the honor of being inducted into the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. Christopher's life's work has been devoted to the health and safety of others; in particular, his hometown community of Deposit. Currently,

Christopher holds the position of First Assistant Department Chief of the Deposit Fire Department. Additionally, he serves as the Team Captain of the Eastern Broome Swift Water Rescue Team, The Vice President of the Deposit Educational Endowment Program, and the President of Windsor Emergency Services, Inc. Christopher works full-time as a Senior Emergency Services Dispatcher. He also provides services as an Emergency Medical Technician for the ambulance service that he helped to establish.

Christopher worked with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey to procure an artifact from the September 11th attack on the World Trade Center on behalf of the Village of Deposit and the Deposit Fire Department. The District is honored to induct Christopher Zacharias into the 2018 Hall of Fame.
